Aft at the back of the boat

Astern behind the boat

Beaufort scale way of measuring wind strength, from force 1 to force 12

Boom spar at the bottom edge of the sail

Bow front of the boat

Bowline useful knot with a loop in it

Buoy floating object attached to the bottom of the sea

Helm the person who steers the boat- also the tiller that they steer with

Jib smaller sail in front of the boat

Knot measurement of speed

Latitude imaginary lines running around the globe from east to west

Leeward opposite side to where the wind is blowing

Lifejacket an aid to keep a person afloat and their head above water

Longitude imaginary lines running around the globe from north to south

Mast the spar that the sails are hoisted up on shorter mast at the back of the boat

Port left hand side of the boat (facing forwards)

Rudder attached to the stern and controls the direction of the boat

Starboard right hand side of the boat (facing forward)

Stern back of the boat

Tiller stick attached to the rudder to steer the boat
